About the Event

- Your choice: make it a one day, two day or three-day event.
- Up to a three-day, two-night hiking and camping (or backpack trip) through the Northern Kettle Moraine State Forest.
- Consists of three separate segments on the Ice Age Trail System, Friday evening, Saturday and Sunday respectively.
- Within a two-hour drive of Milwaukee, Madison and Green Bay.

About the Ice Age Trail

The Glacial Trail hike follows a section of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail which is a 1200-mile trail that winds its way across the State of Wisconsin. There are many beautiful sights to see as you hike along the unique hills and through the hollows that the trail traverses. The hills (moraines, kames & drumlins) and hollows (kettles) of the Kettle Moraine State Forest were formed over 10,000 years ago by two lobes of the continental ice sheet that flowed through the region and then subsequently melted.

The Hike

Friday Evening – Shuttle service to trail head run between 4:00 - 6:00pm starting at Greenbush Group Camp to the Old Plank Rd. Trail Head. The hike ends back at the Greenbush Group Camp. Trail distance ≈ 3½ miles

Saturday 5 Mile Hike – Registration and parking at Parnell Tower. Shuttle to the start of the hike at Greenbush from 8:00am – 10:30am and the hike ends back at Parnell Tower.

Saturday 10 Mile Hike − Registration and Parking at Greenbush. Hike Starts 8:00 - 10:00am and ends at Long Lake campground. Shuttle services run from Long Lake to Greenbush from 1:00 - 5:00 p.m. (All 10 mile hikers need to clear Parnell Tower by 1:00 p.m.) Sunday − Registration and parking at Long Lake. Hike starts 8:00 - 10:00am at Long Lake (overflow parking area near the entrance to the 700's loop). End at Mauthe Lake. Shuttles from Mauthe Lake to Long Lake run from 12:30 − 2:00 p.m. Trail distance ≈ 9¼ miles Because of the length of the trail and safety concerns, hikers will not be permitted to start the hike after the designated start time. Self Guided Hike − If you are unable to attend the official event, you are welcome to hike the trails on your own and we will send you a patch and a trail map in the mail. Please check with the local WI DNR station before hiking the trails on your own to find out about current restrictions and information about hunting seasons.

Registration Information

A registration fee of \$12.00 for day hiking, \$7.00 for self guided, or \$22.00 youth (5 and older), \$22.00 Adult (18 and older) (plus \$3 late fee per person if not submitted by April19th) for camping must accompany your registration. All fees include a multi-color anniversary patch and shuttle services.

(Note: Returned checks will be charged a \$25.00 NSF fee.)

Refunds will be issued only if cancellation is received prior to April 19th.

REFUNDS WILL NOT BE PROVIDED AT THE EVENT.

Be advised that electricity is NOT available at Long Lake Campground or at the Greenbush Group Camp.

The Friday & Saturday night camping areas have water and restrooms available. Units that are not backpacking may camp both nights at Long Lake or Greenbush Group Camp.

Friday Registration

Registration is located at the Greenbush Group Camp (on the Kettle Moraine Scenic Drive between Greenbush and State Hwy 67) for groups camping at Greenbush Friday and Friday Day Hikers. We are located in the log cabin, southwest of the entrance station.

For groups staying both nights at Long Lake, registration is located at Long Lake Campground in the main parking lot.

Saturday 5 Mile Hike Morning Registration

Registration and parking for <u>all 5 mile hikers</u> is in the Parnell Tower parking lot.

Saturday 10 Mile Hike Morning Registration

Registration for day-hikers and late arrivals is located at the Greenbush Group Camp.

Sunday Morning Registration

Registration for day-hikers is located in the Long Lake Campground (the overflow parking area near the entrance to the 700's loop).

Shuttle Service

Shuttle services provided by Badger Trails are available on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.


Friday shuttle boards at Greenbush and will take you to the Trail Head to begin the hike. You will hike back to Greenbush.

Groups camping at Long Lake on Friday night must provide their own transportation on Friday evening and Saturday morning to the beginning of the hikes at Greenbush Group Camp.

Saturday 5 mile hike shuttle will board at Parnell Tower before the hike. 10 mile hike shuttle will board at Long Lake and will only run to Greenbush after the hike. Vehicles should be moved to Long Lake if you will be camping at Long Lake Saturday night.

Groups camping at Greenbush Group Camp on Saturday must provide their own transportation to the beginning of the hike at Long Lake on Sunday morning.

Sunday shuttle will board at Mauthe Lake and will only run to Long Lake after the hike.



Helpful Reminders

Carry Your Own Food & Water!!! - We will have water available at all checkpoints along the trail to replenish water. There is no place to purchase food along the trail.

Dress For The Weather – Cold, Warm, Rainy??? Be prepared for Mother Nature! **Wear Comfortable, Broken-in Hiking Boots** to prevent blisters, twists and sprains.

WALK Don't Run! – There are a lot of rocks and roots to trip over.

Please Stay On The Trail. – Protect the vegetation from trampling. Leave No Trace!

Be Courteous To Others you meet on the trail. Hikers are there to enjoy the sights and sounds of the forest.

All Campsites are shared. Group campsites at Greenbush Group Camp are shared by up to 40 people. Groups of less than six people may be grouped together on one campsite at Long Lake State Park.

Youth Groups Must Follow Their Organizations Leadership Guidelines. If You Decide To End Your Hike Early, You Must Notify Badger Trails Staff At A Checkpoint!

ADMISSION STICKERS

Admission stickers are required on all vehicles in any Wisconsin State Park or State Forest.

Park admission stickers are *NOT* included in the registration fee. These may be purchased from the DNR upon arrival at any of the campgrounds or online.

Any vehicle found parked without a sticker on its windshield will be fined by the DNR.

FIREWOOD NOTICE

No out-of-state or Wisconsin firewood from more than 10 miles outside of the campground you are staying in will be allowed. Please buy your firewood from certified vendors or at your respective campground (if available). Campers may also call the DNR toll-free firewood hotline at 1-877-303-9663 for more information before planning your trip.
