Self Guided Hike - If you are unable to join us at the official event on April 26th, you will be sent the patch in the mail with a trail map so you can hike the trails on your own. Please check with the local WI DNR station prior to hiking the trails to find out about current restrictions and hunting seasons.

Registered hikers that will be at the event will receive patches when they check in at registration. Patches will be mailed out after the event for those hikers who do not receive patches at the event.

Registrations will also be accepted at the event.

DNR Information

Wisconsin State Park Annual Admission Stickers or Daily Passes are required for all vehicles.

- Admission stickers are not included in the registration fee.
- Admission stickers may be purchased from the DNR upon arrival at the Scuppernong Trail Head Parking Lot or the Southern Kettle Moraine State Forest Headquarters.
- Any vehicle found without a sticker on its windshield will be fined by the DNR.
- Sticker fees may change. Please see the WI DNR website for current fees.

- **Special Notice:** Any returned checks will be charged a \$25.00 NSF fee.

Hiking Trail Options

The Scuppernong Trail Hike can be adjusted to fit the ability of your group and the distance you wish to hike.

2.3 MILE Red Loop

The Red Loop is an intermediate level hike which is short and narrow with steep terrain. This is the only way to describe this loop. You'll pass through pine plantations and hardwood forest.

4.1-MILE Orange Loop

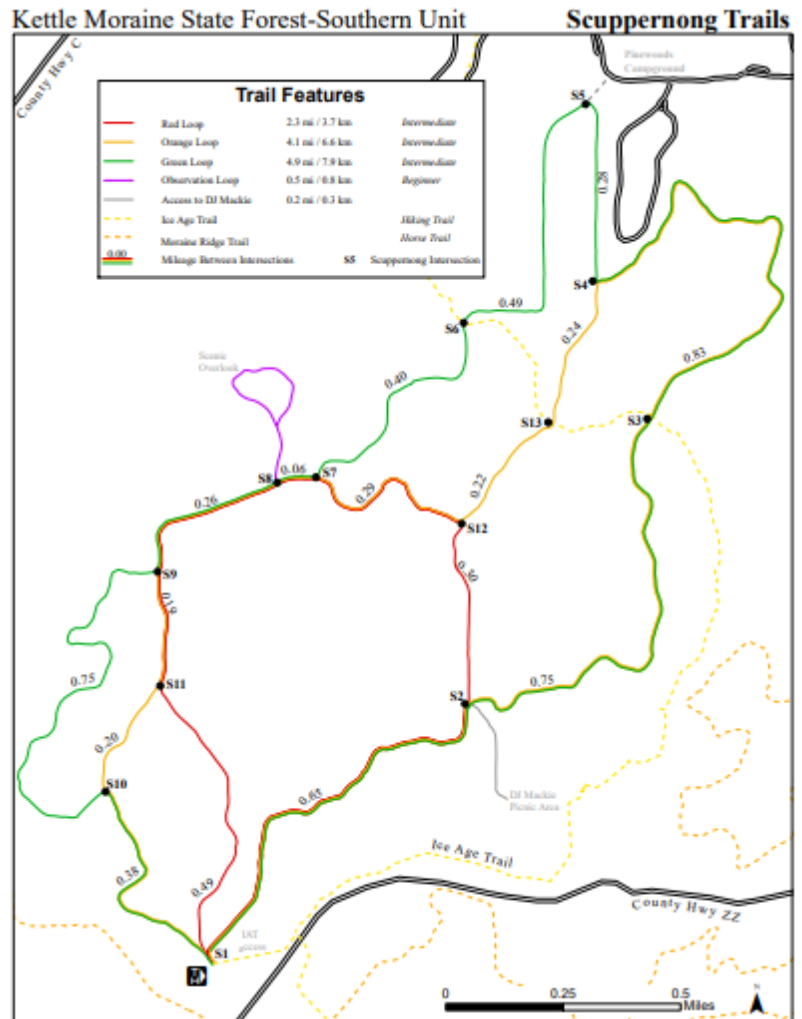
The Orange Loop is an intermediate level hike which will take you deeper within the hardwood forest.

4.9-MILE Green Loop

The Green Loop is an advanced level hike. About halfway on this loop you will pass the edge of the Pinewoods Campground. As you continue through the pines, walk quietly down these old fire lands. When making your final descent from the ridge to the parking lot, you will experience a roller coaster of hills that you won't soon forget.

.5-MILE Scenic Overlook

The Purple Scenic Overlook Loop is an additional loop you can access from the other trails. Have a seat on a bench and enjoy the views of Ottawa Lake and the surrounding area.



Important Information

- All registered hikers will receive the 6th Annual Scuppernong Hike Commemorative Patch.
- If you are unable to attend the official event, you are welcome to hike the trails at anytime. We will send you the patch and trail map in the mail. Please check in with the local WI DNR station for current restrictions and information about hunting seasons.
- This is a self guided hike. The three different trails are clearly color coded. You may choose to hike any of the trails. Make sure you are following the trail you are intending to hike. Do not hike on the Ice Age Trail.
- Youth groups must follow their organizations leadership guidelines. Youth will not be permitted on the trail without adult supervision.
- Participants are encouraged to bring water and food. There is no food or water along the trail. Water is available at the trail head parking lot. There are picnic tables at the trail head parking lot.
- All hikers should have good walking boots or walking shoes to prevent blisters, twists and sprains.

Other Badger Trails' Events

Glacial Trail Hike May 2nd - 4th 2025

Hike, backpack and camp in Wisconsin's beautiful Northern Kettle Moraine State Forest. This event can be backpacked over two to three days, or camp both nights at Greenbush Group Camp or Long Lake State Campground. You can also join us just for the hike on any of the days. Hike 3.5 or 6.5 miles on Friday, 5 or 10 miles on Saturday and 10 miles on Sunday. Badger Trails provides safety checkpoints, water refill stations and free shuttle services to get you back to your vehicles after the hike. All registered participants will receive a commemorative patch.

Devil's Lake Hike Oct 3rd - 5th 2025

The Devil's Lake Hike is held at Devil's Lake State Park located just south of Baraboo Wisconsin. Camp for the weekend at Wisconsin's Largest State Park or join us on Saturday to hike the 500 ft high scenic bluffs. After the hike, join us at a family dance held on the lakefront. All registered participants will receive a commemorative patch.
